### **Dry refuge for golfers**

Damp golfers can finally put away their umbrellas when they return to the clubhouse at Narpanup Golf Club.

Over the past few years the clubhouse roof has deteriorated and started to leak but thanks to Royalties for Regions funding through the Great Southern Development Commission (GSDC), the roof is once again resisting the rain.

Narpanup members applied for funding through the Great Southern Regional Grants Scheme and received a \$4000 Royalties for Regions grant to help replace the roof.

Volunteers removed the old corroded roof in April and replaced it with shiny new cladding.

Club president Ken Pearce said that removing the old roof also exposed some deteriorated timber which the members replaced.

“It gave us the opportunity to maintain the building in good condition,” Mr Pearce said.

GSDC Chief Executive Officer Bruce Manning said the project supported the continuing provision of healthy sport and community activities in the region.

“This is a relatively simple project that maintains a community facility in good order,” Mr Manning said.

“It might be a small project relative to others supported by the Commission, but it is important to the club’s members and to visiting golfers from around the region and beyond who take part in the club’s events.”
