Denmark's Festival of Voice, now in its 15th year, has grown to become one of the highlights on the Great Southern events calendar.

This year's festival program presents a range of talented performers over the June long weekend, boasting more than 90 acts and 28 workshops in 18 venues during the four-day program.

Noongar voices feature strongly in the 2018 Festival, which has focuses on Australian acts, and acts that will appeal to a younger audience.

Performers include Perch Creek, known for their harmony-driven folk music, Australian hip-hop artist Ziggy Ramo, and award-winning Noongar author Kim Scott presenting a series of readings.
